Complete Tool Box uses tools as a focal point for creative and critical thinking and story writing through a process of open-ended questions, discussion and interaction with materials.

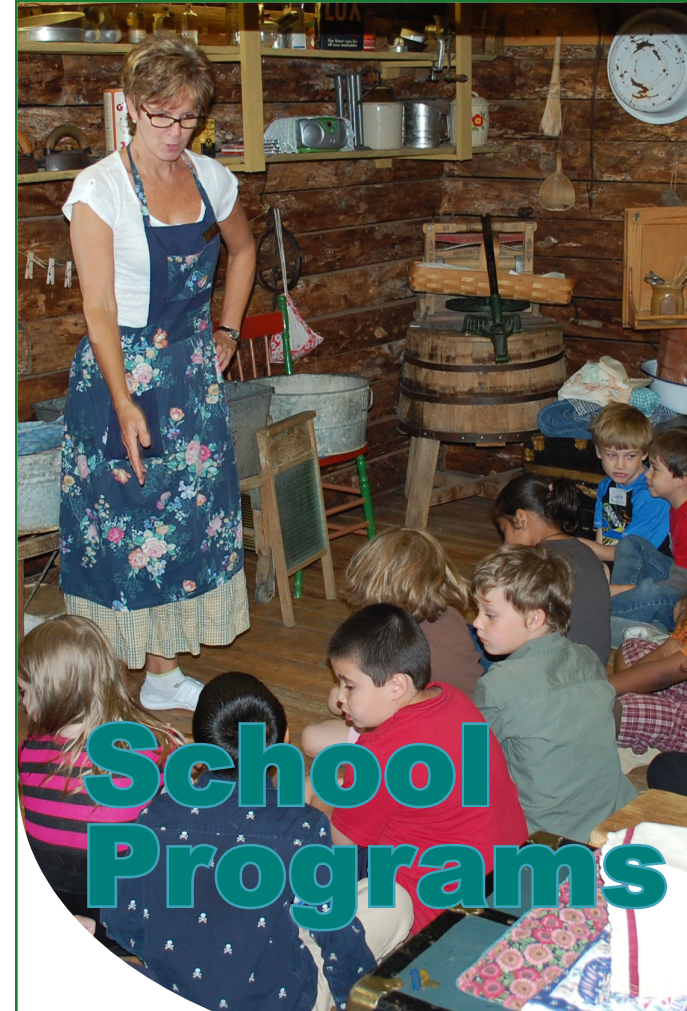
The Making Music kit use musical instruments for creative and critical thinking. Through listening and moving students will become familiar with a variety of musical instruments from other countries as well as Canada.

Pioneer Programs

My Pioneer Family (Soc. St. 1.2 & 2.2)

Use our Settler's Cabin as a historical resource, to show how families of the past have affected and influenced family life today.

Pioneer Field Day (Soc. St. 1.2 & 2.2)

Use artefacts, games, and homemade treats to differentiate between current activities and events of long ago.

Snapshots Through Time (Soc. St. 1.1, 1.2 & 2.2)

Use Stony Plain's murals, to appreciate how stories and events of the past connect their families and communities to the present.

Alberta Storytellers Bring History to Life (Soc.St. 2.2) *📦

Appreciate the stories of the past as told by local seniors, who use the award winning *Multi-Heritage Kits*. Different themes available.

Agriculture Programs

Terra to Table (Sci. Topic E - Soc. St. 2.1, Health W- 2.1 & 2.5)

Investigate the economic impact of the agricultural industry on the community; culminating in baking a snack from agri-products.

SpringThyme (Sci. Topic E)

Recognize and identify the basic needs and interactions of animals, plants and insects and their role within the food chain.

Turn Down the Volume (Gr. 3 Sci. Topic D) 📦

Use Sound Level Meters to measure the loudness of sounds and recognize the dangers of loud sounds to the ear.

Health and Art Programs

Alberta Café! (Health W-1.5, W-2.5, & W-3.5) *📦

Use the Canada Food Guide to recognize the importance of basic healthy nutritional choices, practice reading food labels and explore the benefits of eating locally grown foods.

Uncover the Artist in You *

Use our current gallery exhibition to observe and reflect on artistic style, and express their creativity through different mediums.

Hats Off!! Program Gr. 5-7 📦

Use our historical hat collection to examine and analyze the influences that contribute to self-development and tolerance of cultural differences.

Farm School

Moving the classroom into the world of agriculture, students in grades 4,5,6 spend a week connecting food on their tables to our local farmers - literally from farm to fork. Maintaining key connections to the Alberta school curriculum, students and teachers use this new 'classroom' to engage in hands-on, inquiry-based learning and exploration through tours, journaling, and creative activities. Settlers' Yuletide Gr. K-1 (Soc. St. 1.2)
